## PRESIDING MAGISTRATES' WORK IN MUNICIPAL AND DISTRICT COURTS AND IMPORTANT ASPECTS OF LAW FOR CERTIFIED AND REGISTERED COURT INTERPRETERS HON. LINDA B. KIPLING, ISLAND COUNTY COURT COMMISSIONER

Most people come into contact with the court system through District and Municipal Courts. They resolve traffic tickets, appear in small claims cases or answer to lower level criminal charges. This session will provide a guide to the civil and criminal jurisdiction of the Washington District and Municipal Courts. It will also address some recent changes to the law and the challenges confronting judicial officers as a result.
